CALL FOR ENTRIES! Washington Studio School 2017 Annual Juried Student Show

WSS students do exceptional work! We want to show it off!

WHO CAN SUBMIT:

Anyone who has taken a class or workshop at WSS within the past year.

WHAT IS ELIGIBLE:

Drawings, paintings, prints, sculptures done in WSS classes, workshops, and visiting artist master classes within the past two years, or work that is a direct continuation of work done in these classes. Up to three pieces can be submitted. No work from other schools or programs, please.

WSS faculty members are available and happy to help with submission suggestions, but since the jurying depends on one person's sensibility there is no guarantee that a faculty recommendation will be accepted. This, however, makes each year's show unique in its feel!

IMPORTANT DATES AND INFO:

Submitted work is due by 5pm on Tuesday, June 13. Please label securely on the back with your name, phone number, e-mail address, title of piece and medium, and bring to the library. Work does not have to be framed or wired for the jurying phase. Drawings will be safest if they are in a cardboard or other portfolio.

Jurying process takes place Wednesday, June 14. Work cannot be accepted to the show after this date.

Please pick up work by Thursday, June 23. Accepted work will be labeled as such.

Return accepted work by Friday, July 21. Please have work gallery ready. Drawings show best in a simple frame with some breathing room around the edges. Paintings do not need to be framed, although a simple lattice wood molding from the hardware store is an inexpensive way to finish the edges. All work should be wired for hanging. Please label work on the back with your name, title of piece, medium, price if for sale, and your contact info (e-mail and phone).

Exhibition takes place during the month of August and first two weeks of September with a First Friday reception in September.

JUROR:

This year's juror is Juliana Netschert. She will be looking for work that is technically sound, demonstrates a strong understanding of visual language, and takes the classroom lessons into a personal realm. Shee will also be looking for an overall balanced and unified show.

Juliana Netschert is the Director of the Marsha Mateyka Gallery in the Dupont Circle neighborhood of DC. She is a painter and teacher whose work has been exhibited in solo and group show at WSS, The Adkins Arboretum, the University of Maryland/Parents Association Gallery, Catholic University, N.I.H. and Bell Atlantic. She has also exhibited at The Art Institute of Pittsburgh, the Walt Whitman Center in Camden, NJ, Maryland College of Art and Design, Anton Gallery, WPA spring auctions, and the Athenaeum in Alexandria, VA.
